

# WINNIPEG VETERANS ASKING DEPORTATION

New Soldiers' and Sailors'  
League Expect 10,000  
to Join Request.

Winnipeg, June 25.—Plans for the organization of a Soldiers' and Sailors' Labor League in Winnipeg are being drawn up by a soldiers' committee here. This was announced yesterday by L. Keller, speaking before a gathering of seven or eight hundred returned soldiers in the Norwood baseball grounds. It was said that the constitution would be formed on the lines of a similar league which was started in Vancouver about three weeks ago. It is to be submitted clause by clause to an open meeting of returned soldiers and sailors and modified according to a decision of the majority. The aim stated was to secure representation in the municipal, Provincial and Dominion Governments.

The following resolution with regard to the recent amendment to the Immigration Act was passed:

"We, the returned soldiers and sailors of Canada, and His Majesty's forces, who fought for freedom and liberty and are now resident in the city of Winnipeg, do demand of our Government to deport us to our mother country, according to latest amendment to the Immigration Act, as we find that this country is not governed in the democratic spirit for which we fought."

It was stated by those who presented the resolution that they expect to secure 10,000 signatures before forwarding it to the authorities.
