

900 GERMANS WHO WERE INTERNED TO BE SENT TO GERMANY

To Be Repatriated by the
Dominion Government
at Once

Ottawa, July 19.—Nine hundred Germans who have been held in the internment camps in Canada will soon be speeding homeward to their fatherland. Arrangements have been made for their departure by the Dominion Government, and it is understood they will sail on July 23rd from Montreal or Quebec for Rotterdam, whence they will be sent to Germany.

The 900 have been detained in internment camps at Vernon and Kapuskasing, Ont., and their repatriation will reduce the number of prisoners at those places to a very small figure. They are being shipped to Germany in accordance with the terms of the peace treaty. That treaty provided that as soon as possible after it became operative the allied and associated powers should repatriate German prisoners of war and interned German civilians.
