

GRANTS HABEAS CORPUS

WRIT IN TEST TRIAL CASE

Mathers To Hear Argument In Almazoff Suit Thursday

Chief Justice Mathers this morning granted a writ of habeas corpus in the case of Solomon Pearl Almazoff, one of the four men of foreign birth held under the immigration act.

Argument on a petition for release or bail brought under the writ will be heard before the chief justice Thursday, according to Marcus Hyman, attorney for Almazoff.

The action was brought as a test case. Its decision will apply also to Samuel Blumenberg, Matthew Charitinoff and Oscar Schoppelrei, who are also held at immigration hall. Blumenberg and Charitinoff are still awaiting a hearing before a special board of inquiry. Schoppelrei has been ordered deported.

All four men were arrested June 17, at the times of the raids ordered by the federal government.
