

AUSTRALIA ADHERES TO UNIVERSAL TRAINING

THIRTY THOUSAND OF HER SOLDIERS STILL IN BRITAIN AWAITING SHIPS

(Canadian Associated Cable.)

London, July 31.—Gen. Monash, Commander of the Australian Expeditionary Corps, in the course of an interview here, says that Australia will adhere to her old system of universal training. Future training, he says, must conform strictly to that of the British home army, and every unit of the British overseas forces must be interchangeable.

The Australian authorities announce that any soldier without leave after August 15 will forfeit his return passage. About 30,000 Australians still await repatriation.

One Train of Aliens Sent to the Seaboard

Cochrane, July 31.—The deportation of alien enemies interned at the Kapuskasing Prison Camp, some seventy miles west of Cochrane, has actually commenced. One train-load has already been shipped east to the Atlantic seaboard.

A short time ago certain press despatches declared that the Kapuskasing Prison Camp was closed. Such, of course, was totally erroneous, the number of prisoners remaining there still amounts to upwards of 850.

WAS BUFFALO BILL MAN.

Atlantic City, July 31.—Harry A. Lee, Manager of Buffalo Bill's wild west show when it made its first tour of Europe, died here to-day. He was born in San Francisco, and was widely known among old-time show folks. Later Mr. Lee was Manager of Joseph Jefferson and William J. Florence. He was 68 years old.
