

Various Excuses for Failure to Register

Mike Nozinick did not register under the Military Service act because he lives on the farm and thought that that exempted him from registration. His misguided ideas cost him \$5 and costs in the provincial police court yesterday afternoon, and he was turned over to military authorities.

Orville Blue did not carry his American citizenship papers and his punishment for the omission was \$10 and costs or one month in jail. He was turned over to the American

consul, and if he is not what he claims to be, he will have to join the Canadian army.

Two Russian subjects, Charles Pirnes and Arthur Williamson, were fined \$5 and costs. W. Futoloski, 162 Carlton street, will have to pay \$10 and costs as well as become a soldier.

George Foster, registered as an alien enemy, appeared before Magistrate Noble last month, and was turned over to the military. The authorities were not satisfied, however, that there was definite proof that he is liable for service, so he was sent up for judgment again. As he is a registered alien and there is no proof that he is naturalized, he was dismissed. Three others were dismissed on account of age and foreign citizenship. A number of cases were remanded for further investigation.
