

MINERS AT MINTO MINE IN U. S. TO GO WEST IF COMPANY DOES NOT SETTLE

United Mine Workers to Move Them Instead of Fighting

Sydney, N.S., Nov. 20.—The Minto coal mine strike is on. The United Mine Workers' headquarters at Glace Bay this morning announced that the strike order went into effect at midnight and that it will not be recalled unless the company makes a satisfactory settlement. The trouble is the result of the demand of the men for a ten per cent. wage increase and the award of the board of conciliation granting less than one per cent.

Unless the company makes substantial concessions before Monday, the U.M.W. will commence to transport the miners and their families to Alberta in accordance with the plan announced yesterday. The union has secured employment for all in the western mines, and has no intention of wasting money on a prolonged period of idleness at Minto.
