CANADIANS AND <mark>Aliens</mark> In Fight At Dominion

THE LATTER ATTACK FORMER, CHURCH PEOPLE JOIN IN COUNTER-ONSLAUGHT

(Canadian Press Despatch.) Sydney, N. S., Dec. 15.—A German named Worth is in jail and a Canadian named Campbell is suffering from severe cuts about the head, as a result of a fight between Canadians and alien enemies at Dominlon Sunday night.

The trouble started at Worth's house, where Campbell and a man named M sepherson were attacked by Germans and Austrians. They eluded their assailants and escaped down the street, pursued by the allens. Near the centre of the town they were overtaken and brutally attacked by the followners. Campbell Was stabled in the face and neck several times with a pair of scissors.

Churches were just closing and a crowd quickly rathered and counterattacked the adams. The Germans and Austrians were severely beaten by the enraged Eritishers, and the foreigners were rescued only by the timely appearance of the police, who dispersed the crowd. Worth was taken to fail, and warrants are out for the date adiens.

A similar affray ending in a stabbing occurred at Worth's place a few months ago, according to the police.
