Windsor, has detailed special officers
for duty at Windsor and Walkerville ferry docks and the entrance
to the Michigan Central tunnel.

All foreigners arriving at Windsor are now being closely questioned as to their views on the Soviet form of government. This work is being done by men who have had experience with allens, and any person not giving satisfactory explanation for leaving me United States will in subjected to further inquiry by a

special board.

That the Dominion Government may take similar action to that of the United States authorities in dealing with foreign agitators was intimated to-day by border officers.
