

VETERANS ASK GOVERNMENT TO BAR ALIENS 15 YEARS

Montreal, Mar. 25.—The Federal government is asked to debar aliens from entry into Canada for 15 years in a resolution passed at the convention of the Great War Veterans' Association this morning. The resolution occurs in the report of the immigration, nationalization and deportation committee which was adopted after the time limit recommended had been changed. As originally presented the enemy aliens were to be debarred for five years. The delegates again discussed the bonus question which has come up in the reestablishment recommendations. Yesterday the convention had the main motion and two amendments before it.

The committee appointed to try and secure a compromise resolution between the Calgary and Vancouver bonus plan reported this morning. It recommended a cash bonus for 100 per cent. of forces on a basis of \$1 per day for men who served at the front and reaffirmed the stand taken last year. An amendment was moved which sought to have the plan of last year, which was placed before parliamentary committee, adopted in its entirety. Comrade Peart, of Ontario, moved an amendment that the G. W. V. A. plan be adopted with the "needy" clause eliminated.
