Dr. Erwin Kohlmann, formerly water expert in the Works ment at the City Hall, who resigned a few weeks ago after an agitation arising out of his alleged pro-German views, was taken last night to detention camp at Fort Henry, near Kingston. There were also three Austrians in the party. They were in charge of Lieut. Stagg and a guard from Kingston.

When seen at the Union Station before the departure of the train Dr. Kohlmann declined to make a statement.

Two coaches filled with Austrian prizoners of war arrived last night from the detention camp at Fort Henry en route to Hearst.
