Senator Cloran Calls for I formation on Employees of Enemy Race

Ottawa, March 14.—In the Senate o-night Senator Cloran of Montreal noved for a return showing the names of all employees of enemy race, by birth or extraction, in the Federal service, and also for the names of anadian subjects in the public service of the enemy nations.

The Senator said that German pricovers had been encouraged to escape from the internment camp at Amterst. N.S., by the commanding officer of the camp. He said he had many letters on the subject since he had brought it up before, one from "a 'riend of Canada" in the United States, warning him not to put all the blame on the guards, because there are others outside the camp who are verse traitors. Senator Cloran also said a prominmit resident of New Branswick had
